





Some Past Work... Documentation of Brajnidhi Temple, Jaipur

History 🍂

Shri Brajnidhi temple was built between the years 1778 and 1803 by Maharaja Shri Sawai Pratap Singh of Jaipur and is dedicated to Lord Krishna, him being called Brajnidhi. The statues of Lord Krishna (made in black stone) and goddess Radha (in metal) were installed in the year 1792.


The temple was built in supervision of Seth Goverdhanda, Lala Khatri (carpentry) and Deva Silawat (stone carving).

Sawai Pratap Singh wrote bhajans in praise of Lord Krishna, and used Brajnichi' name as his pen name. He used to write a couplet and a devotional song for Lord Krishna every day and used to recite that song in the temple daily in front of the idol of Brajnidhi. He is the author of the farnous "Brijnidhi Granthawali".

Legend 🎆

A story behind the building of this temple goes like this. Maharaja Sawai Pratap Singh was a devotee of Lord Govinda (Krishna) and was visited by him in his dreams. The deposed Nawab of Awadh, Wazir Ali Khan assassinated a George Frederick Cherry, a political officer of the East India Company. The British government declared him as their enemy.

Wazir Ali Khan did not find shetter anywhere in India then he came to Jaipur and Maharaja Sawai Pratap Singh gave him shetter and pledged that he will never surrender him to the British government. But subsequently succumbing to pressure from the British and Daulat Ram (CM of Jaipur Riyasat), he handed over Wajid Ali Shah to the British. The pledge of Maharaja Pratap Singh was broken and Lord Govinda stopped appearing in his dreams. Maharaja was so disturbed, that he gave up food and water. After some time, Lord Govinda appeared in his dream and ordered him to build a new temple in the Falcae.


